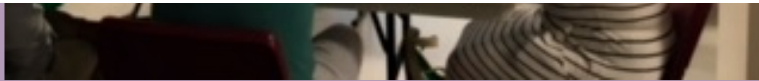

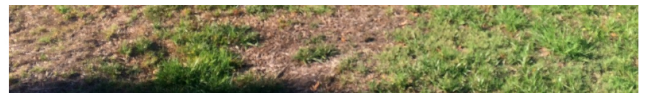
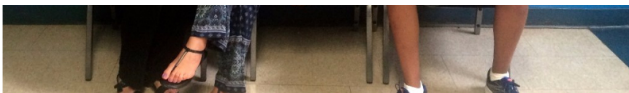
Teacher Workshop

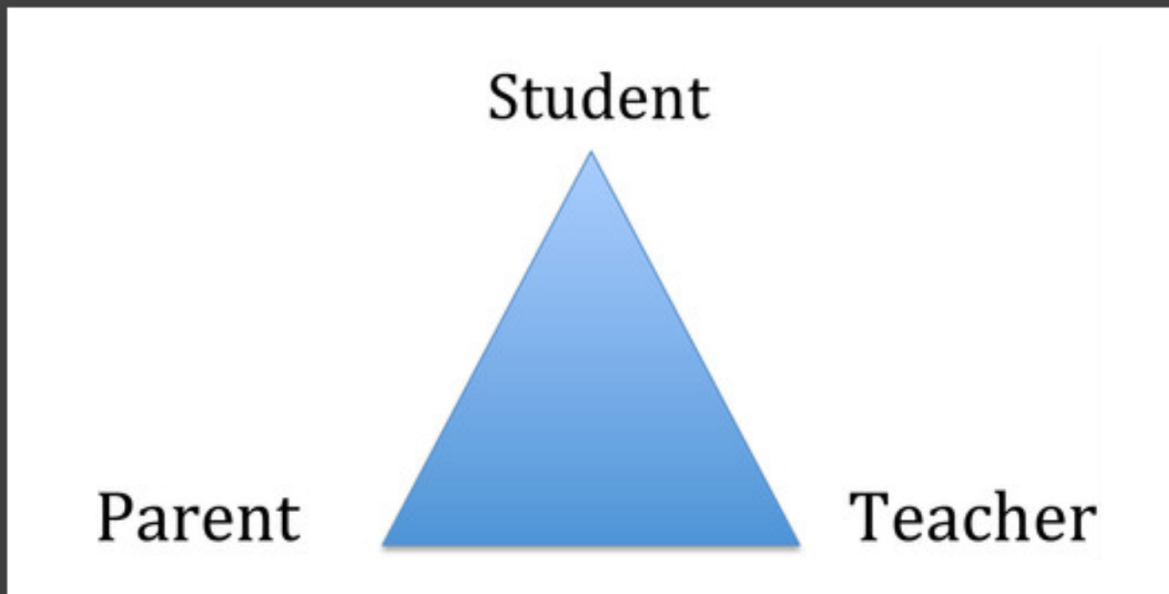
- *"I really appreciated your genuine passion for working to support parents of 2e children."*
